- 9. Registration Renewal Update (Amanda)
 - Number of current renewal applications provided to Council as of December 3
 - Practicing 723 Non-Practicing 44
 - This is below budgeted projection of 775 practicing members
 - Students will be eligible for licensure once they pass the national exam in January.
 That could contribute up to 46 additional members. This will still fall below the projected 775

10. RPNCE transition to CBT Update (Karen)

- Karen provided overview of the current paper and pencil exam and transition plan to a computer based test
- Implementation is anticipated for May 2022. Delays may occur if pandemic continues

11. Results from 2021 exam writings (Karen)

- Analysis of exam results presented for last 5 years
- This analysis does not appear to have been done before. Monitoring of trends will be a regular part of our quality analysis work/public protection accountability going forward

12. Continuing Competence Program Transition (Lacey)

- Proposed new name: Career-long Learning Program (CLP)
- Proposed removing peer-reviewed feedback from requirements
- Discussion of what is considered appropriate goals/activities
- Council found strength in program being focused on RPN Standards

Motion: RPNAS Council approve the transition of the current Continuing Competence Program to the Career-long Learning Program (CLP) effective Jan 1, 2022. The CLP is to include:

- 1. Self-assessment of practice using the current standards of psychiatric nursing practice
- 2. Create learning goal(s) based on the self-assessment
- 3. Complete learning activities that relate to the chosen learning goal(s)
- 4. Reflect on what was learned
- 5. Implement the learning in their practice
- 6. Evaluate the effectiveness of the learning on their practice
- 7. Complete the Reflective Practice Review form

Phased implementation to occur:

- Steps 1 through 4 and 7 required by the membership for the 2022 practice year
- Steps 1 through 7 required by the membership for the 2023 practice year
