 - Trends indicate separation of Association and regulatory functions is becoming best practice
 - SRNA is formally separating, therefore they are in process of forming an association and have invited RPNs to be part of the formation
 - Technically, RPNAS still has association authority however, this needs to be
 discussed and a decision made as to future focus of RPNAS. In the meantime does
 RPNAS council want to provide opportunity to RPNs to be involved in provincial
 development. LPNs have already been invited and are getting involved in
 development

 Discussed issue with recognition of RPN role as a specialized and distinct category of nursing. SUN reference to RPNs within the category of registered nurse is misleading and problematic in terms of having role recognized by administrators, government and public
