**RE: REPRIMAND – LAUREL WALLACE** 

Upon review of the complaint made against you, dated October 5, 2022 (the "Complaint"), and reviewing your response as well as the information gathered during the investigation of the Complaint, the Professional Conduct Committee ("PCC") of the Registered Psychiatric Nurses Association of Saskatchewan ("RPNAS") concluded that, by being dishonest about your work history and an employer reference when applying to an employer; and, practicing as a Registered Psychiatric Nurse in an unreliable manner over a period of years relating to failing to attend work and being non-responsive to employers in a manner that may have impacted your colleagues and the standing of the profession, you may have engaged in professional misconduct as defined by section 28 of the Registered Psychiatric Nurses Act. In the circumstances, the PCC recommended proceeding by way of an Alternative Dispute Resolution Agreement ("ADR"). In addition to meeting the conditions set out in the ADR, you are directed not to engage in any such conduct in the future.

This letter will serve as a formal reprimand.
